WHO'S WHO

John van Gelder - born in Amsterdam, 1946. Worked as a glassblower for 25 years, specializing in glassware for scientific research. He became deaf at the age of 1½ due to complications from measles. Lack of communication during his growing-up years left him with time to daydream and then he decided to make his dreams come true by becoming an actor. he is also a photographer and a sign-language teacher.

Wim Emmerik - born in Amsterdam, 1940. He became deaf from meningitis at the age of one. As a boy, he loved dance and attended the Nel Roos academy to study ballet. After years of dancing and miming, he had a renewed interest in Dutch sign language and became an actor, sign language teacher and researcher at the University of Amsterdam.

Mieke Julien - born in Amsterdam, 1953. Studied education at the University of Amsterdam. For ten years she has worked as a freelance journalist and is also the interpreter for Handtheater.

HANDTHEATER, formed in 1989, is a group of 5
Dutch actors who perform in Dutch sign language.
Their focus is mainly to show the many facets of deaf Dutch culture by way of sign language theater, doing original material and drawing from the works of Dutch writers. They have performed all over the Netherlands and had their U.S. premiere at the Deaf Way in 1989. In 1984, Holland finally recognized the existence and validity of Dutch sign language as the language of the deaf Dutch, and Handtheater is committed to the spread of awareness of Dutch sign language.
